Initial Rewrites (IR)

- Initial Rewrites may earn up to an 80%.
- Students must attend at least one full workshop tutorial and at least begin the rewrite during the tutorial session.
- Due date = 10 calendar days from the day the first draft is returned; if that day falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or other school holiday, the paper is due the next school day by 3:30 p.m., whether or not the student has English class that day.

Secondary Rewrites (SR)

- Secondary rewrites may earn up to a 70%.
- Students must attend at least one full workshop tutorial and at least begin the rewrite during the tutorial session.
- Due date = 3 calendar days from the day the initial rewrite is returned; if that day falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or other school holiday, the paper is due the next school day by 3:30 p.m., whether or not the student has English class that day.

Tune-Ups

- Tune-ups may earn up to an 80%.
- The tune-up is for the student who earns between 20% and 80% on his/her paper and would like to improve his/her grade by rewriting the paper.
- A student does not have to attend a workshop tutorial in order to write a tune-up; however, attendance is recommended.
- Due date = 3 calendar days from the day the first draft is returned; if that day falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or other school holiday, the paper is due the next school day by 3:30 p.m., whether or not the student has English class that day.
